6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to drivers' licenses, and providing  
7 for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 28.15.050(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) Every application for an instruction permit or for an  
11 operator's license shall be made upon a form furnished by the department  
12 and shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee. The fee may not be  
13 refunded to the applicant if the license applied for is denied for fail-  
14 ure to complete examination requirements of the department within 90  
15 days from date of application for a license. The application shall  
16 state the full name, date of birth as proved by a birth certificate  
17 shown to the department, sex and residence address of the applicant,  
18 and briefly describe the applicant and shall state whether the appli-  
19 cant has previously been licensed as an operator, and, if so, when and  
20 by what licensing authority, and whether a license has ever been  
21 suspended, revoked or refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for  
22 suspension, revocation or refusal.

23 \* Sec. 2. AS 28.15.080 is amended to read:

24 Sec. 28.15.080. LICENSES ISSUED TO OPERATORS. Upon payment of  
25 the fee prescribed, the department shall issue an operator's license  
26 to a qualified applicant. The license shall be encased in plastic.  
27 The license shall contain a distinguishing number assigned to the  
28 licensee, the full name, date of birth, address, and a brief description  
29 of the licensee, a picture of the licensee or a notation that no

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facilities were available for picture taking, a space for information  
as to who to notify in case of emergency, a space for the name of the  
licensee's doctor, a space for a notation of any allergies of the  
licensee, and either a facsimile of the signature of the licensee or a  
space upon which the licensee shall write his signature in ink immedi-  
ately upon receipt of the license. A license is not valid until it is  
signed by the licensee.
