6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to employment preference for veterans "

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 39.25.150(23) is amended to read:

9 (23) the granting of employment preference rights to a
10 veteran when he possesses the necessary qualifications in the job
11 classification for which he applies under this chapter; the term
12 "veteran" means a person with 90 days or more active service in the
13 armed forces of the United States who has been honorably discharged
14 after having served during any period between April 6, 1917, and
15 December 1, 1919, between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1947,
16 or between June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955, or one who has served
17 on active duty for a period of more than 180 consecutive days after
18 January 31, 1955, and who has been separated from the armed forces
19 under honorable conditions; the term "disabledveteran" means a veteran
20 who is rated by the United States Veterans' Administration as having
21 at least a 10 per cent service-connected disability; in the examination
22 to determine the qualification of applicants for entrance into the
23 classified service under merit system examination, five additional
24 points shall be added to the passing grade of a veteran and ten addi-
25 tional points shall be added to the passing grade of a disable veteran;
26 if a position in the classified service is eliminated, employees shall
27 be released in accordance with rules which give due effect to all factors;
28 if all job qualifications are equal, the veteran shall be given pre-
29 ference over the nonveteran and the veteran shall be kept on the job.
