6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to release of persons before trial."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 12.30.020(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) A person charged with an offense shall, at his first appear-
10 ance before a judicial officer, be ordered released pending trial on
11 his personal recognizance or upon the execution of an unsecured ap-
12 pearance bond in an amount specified by the judicial officer unless
13 the officer determines that the release of the person will not reason-
14 ably assure the appearance of the person as required, or will pose a
15 danger to other persons and the community.

16 * Sec. 2. AS 12.30.020(b) is amended to read:

17 (b) If a judicial officer determines under (a) of this section
18 that the release of a person will not reasonably assure the appearance
19 of the person, or will pose a danger to other persons and the community,
20 the judicial officer may

21 (1) place the person in the custody of a designated person
22 or organization agreeing to supervise him;

23 (2) place restrictions on the travel, association, or place
24 of abode of the person during the period of release;

25 (3) require the person to return to custody after daylight
26 hours on designated conditions;

27 (4) require the execution of an appearance bond in a speci-
28 fied amount and the deposit in the registry of the court, in cash or
29 other security, a sum not to exceed 10 per cent of the amount of the

bond; the deposit to be returned upon the performance of the condition of release;

(5) require the execution of a bail bond with sufficient solvent sureties or the deposit of cash; or

(6) impose any other condition considered reasonably necessary to assure the defendant's appearance as required and the safety of other persons and the community.
