6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to removal and concealment of mer-
7 chandise.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 11.20.275 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 11.20.275. REMOVAL AND CONCEALMENT OF MERCHANDISE. (a) A
11 person who takes or removes any merchandise or thing of value from the
12 premises where the merchandise or thing of value is kept for the
13 purposes of sale, barter or storage without the consent of the owner
14 or person lawfully entitled to the possession of the merchandise or
15 thing of value is guilty of a misdemeanor.

16 (b) A person who, without authority, wilfully conceals upon or
17 about his person any merchandise or thing of value while still upon the
18 premises where the merchandise or thing of value is kept for purposes
19 of sale, barter or storage without the consent of the owner or person
20 lawfully entitled to its possession is guilty of a misdemeanor.

21 (c) Any merchandise or thing of value found concealed upon or
22 about the person and which has not been purchased by the person is
23 prima facie evidence of wilful concealment under (b) of this section.

24 (d) In this section "consent" means express consent, or consent
25 implied by possession of a sales ticket, slip or receipt issued for
26 and accompanied by the article or articles of merchandise or other
27 thing of value.
