6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the suspension or revocation  
7 of liquor licenses."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 04.15.100 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 04.15.100. PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF TITLE OR MUNICIPAL  
11 ORDINANCE. (a) A person who violates any provision of this title  
12 other than sec. 80 of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor, and  
13 upon conviction is punishable by imprisonment of not more than one  
14 year, or by a fine of not more than \$500. Each violation is a  
15 separate offense.

16 (b) Upon conviction of a licensee for a violation under  
17 subsection (a) of this section, or for violation of a municipal  
18 ordinance adopted by a municipality in conformity with sec. 70 of  
19 this chapter, the judge having jurisdiction shall send a notification of  
20 conviction together with a [THE] certified copy of the record of  
21 conviction [TRANSCRIPT OF THE PROCEEDINGS] to the board. The board  
22 may, upon the direction of a majority of its members, thereupon  
23 suspend the license as hereinafter provided for the first and  
24 second violations and upon a third violation may revoke the license  
25 and declare the bond forfeited [MAY REVOKE THE LICENSE AND MAY UPON  
26 A THIRD VIOLATION FORFEIT THE BOND]. For the purpose of this section,  
27 the terms "second violation" and "third violation" include only  
28 those violations which occur within five years of the first violation.

but are not limited to repeated violations of the same statutory provision or municipal ordinance.

(1) First violation. The license of the premises involved may be suspended for not less than 10 nor more than 45 days;

(2) Second violation. The license of the premises involved may be suspended for a period of not less than 30 days nor more than 90 days.
