6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the State Agency Council on Alcoholism."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 44.29 is amended by adding new sections to read:

9 ARTICLE 4. STATE AGENCY COUNCIL ON ALCOHOLISM.

10 Sec. 44.29.170. STATE AGENCY COUNCIL ON ALCOHOLISM. There is
11 established in the Department of Health and Welfare a state agency
12 council on alcoholism.

13 Sec. 44.29.180. COMPOSITION. The members of the state agency
14 council on alcoholism shall be selected by the governor and should
15 include, but is not limited to, representation from

16 (1) Office of Economic Opportunity

17 (2) Department of Education

18 (A) division of instructional services

19 (B) division of vocational education

20 (C) division of vocational rehabilitation

21 (3) Department of Health and Welfare

22 (A) division of public welfare

23 (B) division of public health

24 (C) branch of nursing

25 (D) division of mental health

26 (E) youth and adult authority

27 (F) office of the aging

28 (G) office of mental retardation

29 (H) health and welfare facilities

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- (4) Department of Labor
 - (A) division of employment security
- (5) Department of Revenue
 - (A) alcoholic beverage control board
- (6) Department of Law
- (7) Department of Administration
 - (A) division of personnel
- (8) University of Alaska
- (9) Department of Public Safety

Sec. 44.29.190. MEETINGS. The state agency council on alcoholism shall meet not less than six times a year.

Sec. 44.29.200. DUTIES. The state agency council on alcoholism shall

- (1) make possible the maximum utilization of existing state programs for the benefit of the alcoholic;
- (2) consider means of strengthening generic services;
- (3) seek ways of providing a comprehensive program with avoidance of duplication of services;
- (4) consider efficient use of existing manpower;
- (5) consider means of developing needed manpower resources;
- (6) consider, develop, and execute a plan for coordination of state efforts in behalf of the alcoholic between state, federal and private agencies providing services;
- (7) keep the Coordinator of Alcoholism Programs and other council members informed on matters relating to the programs administered by their respective departments; and
- (8) assist in interpreting the program of the office of alcoholism to various department members.

Sec. 44.29.210. OFFICERS. The Coordinator of Alcoholism Programs

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is the chairman of the council. A secretary shall be elected from the members of the council.

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
