6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the codification of ordinances."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 29.08.200 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 29.08.200. LIMIT ON HOME RULE POWER TO PUNISH ORDINANCE
10 VIOLATIONS. (a) A home rule city may not impose criminal penalties
11 for the violation of a general ordinance unless the ordinance is codi-
12 fied and copies of the ordinance are made available for distribution to
13 the public.

14 (b) In this section "codified" means that the ordinance has been
15 given a serial number or other permanent indentifying number and,
16 bearing a notation of the date of adoption and the designation of the
17 adopting authority. it has been entered by the municipal clerk in a
18 properly indexed book maintained for the purposes of organizing and re-
19 gording the ordinances.

20 * Sec. 2. AS 29.10.195(a) is amended to read:

21 (a) The council may prescribe the punishment for the violation of
22 any ordinance, but the punishment shall not exceed a fine of \$300 or
23 imprisonment in a city jail for 30 days, or both, together with the
24 costs of prosecution. However, the punishment authorised under this
25 subsection may be imposed only if the ordinance is codified and copies
26 of the ordinance are made available for distribution to the public. In
27 this subsection "codified" means that the ordinance has been given a
28 serial number or other permanent indentifying number and, bearing a
29 notation of the date of adoption and the designation of the adopting
