6 For an Act entitled: An Act relating to work furloughs for prisoners."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 35.30.250(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) When a person is convicted of a crime [MISDEMEANOR] and is
10 sentenced to a prison facility, or is imprisoned in the prison facility
11 for nonpayment of a fine, for contempt, or as a condition of probation
12 for a criminal offense, the commissioner may, if he concludes that the
13 person is a fit subject for a work furlough and is not prohibited from
14 it under (g) of this section, direct that the person be permitted to
15 continue in his regular employment, if that is compatible with the re-
16 quirements of (c) of this section, or may authorize the person to secure
17 employment for himself, unless the court at the time of sentencing has
18 ordered that the person not be granted work furloughs.

19 * Sec. 2. AS 33.30.250 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

20 (g) A work furlough may not be authorized for a prisoner
21 (1) identified with large-scale, organized criminal activity;
22 (2) serving a sentence for a violent crime;
23 (3) with serious emotional or personality problems, as
24 determined by the commissioner;
25 (4) with a history of violent or assaultive behavior;
26 (5) not in good health;
27 (6) addicted to the use of drugs; or
28 (7) whose presence in the community is likely to evoke adverse
29 public reaction toward the inmate, the institution and the state.
