5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for relocation of the capital from
7 Juneau upon approval of the electorate of the state;
8 and providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. (a) The secretary of state is directed to prepare the
11 following proposition to be placed on the general election ballot and sub-
12 mitted to the electorate of the state at the general election to be held on
13 November 5, 1968:

14 "Shall the capital of the State of Alaska be relocated from
15 Juneau to a place designated by the First Session of the
16 Sixth Legislature convening in 1969?

19 (b) The secretary of state shall certify the results of the elec-
20 tion on the proposition and submit the results to the First Session of the
21 Sixth Legislature on the day it convenes.

22 * Sec. 2. (a) If, at the state general election on November 5, 1968, the
23 majority of votes cast on the proposition specified in sec. 1 of this Act
24 are affirmative votes, the capital of the state, on a date specified by the
25 First Session of the Sixth Legislature, shall cease to be at Juneau and shall
26 be at a place designated by law amending AS 44.06.010.

27 (b) If, at the state general election of November 5, 1968, the
28 majority of votes cast on the proposition specified in sec. 1 of this Act are
29 negative votes, the capital of the state shall remain at Juneau.

1 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval
2 or on the day it becomes law without approval.
