6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to burglary tools."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 11.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

9 Sec. 11.20.105. POSSESSION OF INSTRUMENT WITH BURGLARIOUS INTENT;
10 MAKING, ALTERATION OR REPAIR OF INSTRUMENT. (a) Every person who
11 makes or mends or causes to be made or mended, or has in his possession,
12 any engine, machine, tool, false key, picklock, bit, nippers or implement
13 adapted, designed or commonly used for the commission of burglary,
14 larceny or other crime, under circumstances evincing an intent to use
15 or allow it to be used in the commission of a crime, or knowing that it
16 is intended to be so used, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

17 (b) The possession of an instrument set out in (a) of this section,
18 except by a mechanic, artificer or tradesman in his established shop or
19 place of business open to public view shall be prima facie evidence that
20 the possession was had with intent to use or allow it to be used in the
21 commission of a crime.
