6 For an Act entitled: "An Act regulating licensing and registration of
7 pharmacists; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 08.80.110 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 08.80.110. QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION. An applicant
11 for registration as a pharmacist shall

12 (1) be at least 21 years of age, a citizen of the United
13 States and fluent in the reading, writing and speaking of the English
14 language;

15 (2) furnish the board with at least two affidavits from
16 reputable citizens attesting to his good moral character and freedom
17 from addiction to the use of drugs or alcoholic liquors;

18 (3) be a graduate of a [RECOGNIZED] college of pharmacy
19 recognized by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy;

20 (4) pass an examination by a board of pharmacy which board
21 has been approved by the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy
22 [HOLD A CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION IN THE BASIC SCIENCES AS PROVIDED
23 IN AS 08.16.200].

24 * Sec. 2. AS 08.80.120 is amended to read:

25 Sec. 08.80.120. GRADING AND CONTENT OF EXAMINATION. To pass
26 the state pharmacy examination each [EACH] applicant must [SHALL]
27 attain [ON THE EXAMINATION] a general average of not less than 75 per
28 cent and a grade of not less than 60 per cent [IN AN EXAMINATION] in
29 each of the following subjects on the examination: jurisprudence,

1 chemistry, calculations, dispensing pharmacy, pharmacy, materia
2 medica and related subjects. [TOXICOLOGY AND POSOLOGY, COMPOUNDING
3 OF PRESCRIPTIONS, LAWS RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY] and in
4 the discretion of the board [EXAMINER], practical pharmacy.

5 * Sec. 3. AS 08.80.140 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

6 Sec. 08.80.140. LICENSE BY RECIPROCITY. The board may register
7 without examination an applicant who is otherwise qualified and who
8 has been certified as a registered pharmacist by the National Associa-
9 tion of Boards of Pharmacy.

10 * Sec. 4. AS 08.80.160 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

11 Sec. 08.80.160. FEES. The following fees shall be imposed under
12 this chapter when applicable

13	(1) Examination fee	\$50
14	(2) Re-examination fee	15
15	(3) Reciprocity investigation fee	25
16	(4) Biennial pharmacist license fee	20
17	(5) Temporary license fee	10
18	(6) Wholesale dealer biennial license fee	50
19	(7) Retail dealer biennial license fee	20.

20 * Sec. 5. AS 08.80.250 is amended to read:

21 Sec. 08.80.250. RENEWAL OF LAPSED REGISTRATION. A previously
22 licensed pharmacist who has not been registered for a period of three
23 years or more shall take an oral examination before the board and
24 satisfy it of his competence before the renewal of his registration.

25 * Sec. 6. AS 08.80.260 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

26 (7) conviction of selling federal legend drugs without
27 prescription of a licensed physician, surgeon, dentist or veterinarian.

28 * Sec. 7. The following laws are repealed: AS 08.80.110(4), 08.80.170;
29 08.80.180; 08.80.190; 08.80.200 and 08.80.210.
