6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the possession of firearms by
7 persons convicted and pardoned of crime."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 11.55.030 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 11.55.030. POSSESSION BY CONVICTS. A person who has been
11 convicted of a felony, or a misdemeanor involving assault and battery,
12 assault with a dangerous weapon, burglary, robbery and like crimes, by
13 a court in the state, or by the courts of the United States or of
14 another state or territory, may not own or have in his possession or
15 under his custody or control a pistol, revolver, or other firearm
16 capable of being concealed about his person, or carry concealed about
17 his person a knife with a blade over two inches long or a dirk or dag-
18 ger, slingshot, metal knuckles, or an instrument by the use of which
19 injury could be inflicted upon the person or property of another.

20 A person who has been convicted and pardoned of a crime mentioned in
21 this section may apply to the local chief of police or magistrate for
22 a permit to possess a firearm described in this section for hunting
23 purposes, and shall be granted the permit if it is, in the discretion
24 of the chief of police, consistent with the public safety.
