5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the posting of a bond by certain
7 employers to assure the payment of wages to employees."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.10 is amended by adding a new section to Art. 2 to
10 read:

11 Sec. 23.10.148. WAGE PAYMENT BOND. (a) A proprietorship,
12 company, or business in the state which is engaged in handling, canning
13 processing, curing, or storing fish, shellfish, or other forms of
14 animal life, or any of their by-products, which does not have lienable
15 real property in the State of Alaska valued in excess of \$10,000 or four
16 or less employees, shall post a wage payment bond in the amount of
17 \$10,000 with the Department of Labor before obtaining an Alaska business
18 license.

19 (b) Before obtaining an Alaska business license application must
20 be made to the Department of Labor. The application must contain:

21 (1) the name of the business and a list of all principals
22 involved in the business and all persons who will gain a profit from its
23 operation;

24 (2) the number of employees, the names of employees, and
25 social security numbers of employees employed by the business;

26 (3) the location, description, and value of all lienable
27 real property owned by the business in the State of Alaska.

28 (c) The Department of Labor may execute upon this bond when it
29 has ascertained that the business posting the bond has failed to pay

1 its employees agreed upon wages in compliance with secs. 50 - 150 of
2 this chapter.

3 (d) Failure to post the bond with the Department of Labor before
4 the purchase of a business license is a misdemeanor and is punishable
5 by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$2,000, or by imprisonment
6 for not less than 10 days or more than 90 days, or by both. Each day
7 of violation is a separate offense.
