6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to employment practices on state
7 leased mineral lands."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 38.05 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 38.05.143. EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES ON STATE MINERAL LANDS. (a)

11 A person leasing state land as provided for in secs. 135 - 180 of this
12 chapter shall

13 (1) establish and maintain an on-the-job training program
14 approved by the Department of Labor which will train Alaska residents
15 in the technical skills required in the exploration, development and
16 extraction of minerals; and

17 (2) employ, in the exploration, development or extraction of
18 minerals on the leased property, at least 60 per cent Alaska residents
19 during the first year, 75 per cent Alaska residents during the second
20 year and 90 per cent Alaska residents during the third and subsequent
21 years of the lease.

22 (b) The Department of Labor shall make reasonable and necessary
23 regulations to carry out the purpose of this section and shall issue a
24 certificate to persons meeting the requirements set out in (a) of this
25 section.

26 (c) The Department of Labor shall hold formal hearings for those
27 persons who are denied a certificate as provided for in (b) of this
28 section. The person denied certification must prove that he is unable
29 to comply with this section because the local labor market is unable

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to supply either enough personnel for training or that specially
trained personnel is unavailable within the state.
