5 Relating to the establishment of  
6 a Coast Guard Station at the mouth  
7 of Cook Inlet.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS the year-round shipment of freight by tug, barge, and ship on  
10 Cook Inlet is increasing each year; and

11 WHEREAS tankers are now making regular year-round trips to Cook Inlet  
12 for the purpose of moving Alaska oil; and

13 WHEREAS the commercial fishery of the lower Cook Inlet area is of  
14 considerable volume and is increasing on a year-round basis; and

15 WHEREAS this great and increasing volume of commercial maritime activ-  
16 ity requires expanded area services for the protection of this commerce and  
17 those who engage in it;

18 BE IT RESOLVED that the Honorable Lyndon B. Johnson, President of the  
19 United States, is respectfully requested to have the Secretary of the  
20 Treasury direct the installation of a United States Coast Guard station on  
21 the lower Kenai Peninsula near the mouth of Cook Inlet.

22 COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Henry H. Fowler,  
23 Secretary of the Treasury; Admiral Willard J. Smith, Commandant, United  
24 States Coast Guard; and to the Honorable E.L. Bartlett and the Honorable  
25 Ernest Gruening, U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Howard W. Follock, U.S.  
26 Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
