5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act changing the average daily membership allotment  
7 in the public school foundation program.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 14.17.060(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) The average daily membership allotment for each district is as  
11 follows:

12 (1) if the district is in the Southeastern Senate District:  
13 \$155 [\$140] times average daily membership;

14 (2) if the district is in the Southcentral Senate District:  
15 \$165 [\$150] times average daily membership;

16 (3) if the district is in the Central and Northwest Senate  
17 Districts and that part of the Southcentral Senate District lying west  
18 152° west longitude: \$175 [\$160] times the average daily attendance.

19 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.17 is amended by adding a new section to read:

20 Sec. 14.17.075. SUPPLEMENTAL ALLOCATION. (a) In addition to the  
21 amounts authorized to be paid to school districts under this chapter, a  
22 supplemental allocation equivalent to \$15 per pupil in total average  
23 daily membership for the purpose of further equalization of disparities  
24 due to size and availability of local resources may be made. These  
25 allocations shall be distributed on the basis of average daily member-  
26 ship in the inverse ratio that each district's total equivalent evalua-  
27 tion per pupil bears to the average equivalent evaluation per pupil.  
28 However, for a district whose total equivalent evaluation per pupil is  
29 below the average, and whose average daily membership is below 600, the

1 allocation may be increased by 10 per cent for each unit of 100 by which  
2 the district average daily membership, rounded to the nearest 100, is  
3 less than 600, provided that the district makes a local contribution of  
4 not less than that which would be raised by a 10-mill levy.

5 (b) For purposes of computing allocations under this section,  
6 total equivalent evaluation per pupil is the sum of the amount that  
7 50 per cent of the P.L. 874 entitlement would represent as the base of  
8 a 10-mill levy and the evaluation of the district, divided by the  
9 average daily membership. The reports of the public school foundation  
10 program shall be used in applying this program.

11 (c) The commissioner shall make such adjustments as are necessary  
12 to insure that no district receives less than \$15 per pupil in ADM under  
13 this section when increased payments to the district from state tuition  
14 over the prior year are considered.
