6 For an Act entitled: "An Act changing the fee for bingo, raffles and ice
7 pools; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 05.15.020 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 05.15.020. ANNUAL PERMIT AND FEE. (a) No activity permitted
11 under this chapter may be conducted unless an annual provisional permit
12 issued by the department is first obtained and a fee of \$10 is paid to
13 the department.

14 (b) There is an additional permit fee equal to one per cent of the
15 gross receipts in excess of \$1,000.

16 (c) By February 15 of each year following that for which a pro-
17 visional permit has been issued, the permittee shall submit to the
18 commissioner an affidavit showing the amount of gross receipts under
19 the provisional permit along with remittance of the additional fee.

20 (d) No activity is permitted for a period of 15 days after appli-
21 cation.

23 Sec. 05.15.090. REPORTS TO THE LEGISLATURE BY COMMISSIONER OF
24 REVENUE, ATTORNEY GENERAL AND COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY. [WITHIN
25 10 DAYS AFTER THE CONVENING OF THE LEGISLATURE EACH YEAR THE] The
26 commissioner of revenue shall submit to the legislature before March 1
27 each year a detailed report containing a summary of all reports required
28 of permittees and recommending a permit fee scale that will cover costs
29 of administration and enforcement. The attorney general and the

commissioner of public safety shall, [WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER THE CONVENING
OF THE LEGISLATURE EACH YEAR,] submit to the legislature before March 1
each year, a jointly prepared, detailed report outlining the effect,
if any, of the operation of this chapter on the legal and law enforce-
ment activities of the state.

* Sec. 3. This Act takes effect January 1, 1968.
