6 For an Act entitled: "An Act extending employment security coverage to
7 employees of the state; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 23.20.520(12) is amended to read:

11 (12) "employing unit" means an individual or type of organi-
12 zation, including the State of Alaska but not its municipalities or
13 other political subdivisions, partnership, association, trust, estate,
14 joint trust company, insurance company or domestic or foreign corpora-
15 tion, or the receiver, referee in bankruptcy, trustee, or successor of
16 one of these, or the legal representative of a deceased person, which
17 has or subsequent to January 1, 1937, had one or more individuals per-
18 forming service for it within the state; an individual performing
19 services inside the state for an employing unit which maintains two or
20 more separate establishments inside the state is considered as employed
21 by a single employing unit for the purposes of this chapter;

22 * Sec. 2. AS 23.20.525(b) is amended by adding a new subsection to
23 read:

24 (5) service performed on and after April 1, 1966, by an
25 individual for the state, and benefits are payable to an individual
26 who establishes a benefit year on or after July 1, 1967, based upon
27 wages earned for such employment.

28 * Sec. 3. AS 23.20.525(c)(12) is amended to read:

29 (12) service performed in the employ of [THIS STATE OR] a

1 municipality or other political subdivision of this state, except as
2 provided in sec. 325 of this chapter;

3 * Sec. 4. AS 23.20.525(c) is amended by adding new subsections to read:

4 (22) service performed on an unemployment work relief project
5 undertaken by this state or a subdivision of this state;

6 (23) service performed by members of the faculty of state
7 and public schools, colleges, or universities.

8 * Sec. 5. AS 23.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

9 Sec. 23.20.272. STATE PAYMENTS TO THE FUND. Notwithstanding
10 secs. 165 - 270 of this chapter, the state, in lieu of employer and
11 employee contributions required by this chapter, shall pay to the
12 commissioner for the unemployment compensation fund an amount equiva-
13 lent to the amount of benefits paid to individuals based upon wages
14 paid by the state. If an individual during the base period was em-
15 ployed by both the state and other employers subject to the provisions
16 of this chapter, the amount to be paid into the fund by the state, with
17 respect to that individual, shall be an amount equal to the additional
18 cost of benefit payments made from the fund which would not have been
19 incurred but for the inclusion of earnings from state employment in the
20 individual's determination of benefit rights. The amount of payments
21 required under this section to be made into the fund shall be ascer-
22 tained by the department once each quarter and shall be payable from
23 the general fund of the state, except as provided hereafter. If an
24 individual to whom benefits were paid was paid wages by the state dur-
25 ing the base period from a special or administrative fund provided by
26 law, the payment to the commissioner for the unemployment compensation
27 fund shall be made from the special or administrative fund. If the base
28 period wages of an individual include both wages for state employment
29 paid from the general fund of the state and wages for state employment

1 paid from special or administrative funds, the amount to be paid into
2 the unemployment compensation fund under this section with respect to
3 the benefits paid these individuals shall be prorated among the state
4 funds in proportion to the wages paid to the individual from each fund
5 during the base period. The payment by the state into the unemploy-
6 ment compensation fund shall be made at the times and in the manner
7 prescribed by the commissioner by regulation.

8 * Sec. 6. AS 23.20.325(a) is amended to read as follows:

9 (a) A service performed for an employing unit, including [STATE
10 DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES,] municipalities, or other political subdivi-
11 sions of the state, which is excluded under the definition of employ-
12 ment, and with respect to which no payments are required under the em-
13 ployment security law of another state or of the federal government, is
14 considered employment for all purposes of this chapter if the department
15 approves a written election to that effect filed by the employing unit
16 for which the service is performed, as of the date stated in the ap-
17 proval. The department may not approve an election unless it (1) in-
18 cludes all the service of the type specified in each establishment or
19 place of business for which the election is made, and (2) is made for
20 not less than two calendar years.

21 * Sec. 7. This Act takes effect July 1, 1967.
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
