6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to veterinarians."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 08.98.050(3) is amended by adding a new subsection to
9 read:

10 (G) falsifies an official state or federal certificate
11 relating to veterinary medicine.

12 * Sec. 2. AS 08.98.210 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

13 Sec. 08.98.210. OUT-OF-STATE VETERINARIAN. A veterinarian in
14 good standing in a veterinary association of another state or territory
15 or the District of Columbia which licenses veterinarians to practice
16 veterinary medicine may be licensed without examination and otherwise
17 upon substantially the same terms and conditions as are fixed in the
18 jurisdiction from which he has come for the licensure of a veterinarian
19 from this state. As a prerequisite to licensure the board shall require
20 a veterinarian to take and pass an examination, unless the applicant
21 has

22 (1) passed a state veterinarian examination;

23 (2) engaged in the active practice of veterinary medicine
24 for at least five out of the previous seven years before filing the
25 application excluding time spent in the military service of the United
26 States;

27 (3) graduated from an accredited school of veterinary medi-
28 cine;

29 (4) met the character requirements established by the board.
