5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to veterans' employment preference
7 rights; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 39.25.150(23) is amended to read:

10 (23) the granting of employment preference rights to a
11 veteran when he possesses the necessary qualifications in the job
12 classification for which he applies under this chapter; the term
13 "veteran" means a person with 90 days or more active service in the
14 armed forces of the United States who has been honorably discharged
15 after having served during any period between April 6, 1917, and
16 December 1, 1919, between September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1947,
17 [OR] between June 27, 1950, and January 31, 1955, or between August 4,
18 1964, and a date to be determined by the legislature which shall be
19 on or about six months after the termination of hostilities involving
20 forces of the United States in Viet Nam; the term "disabled veteran"
21 means a veteran who is rated by the United States Veterans' Administra-
22 tion as having at least a 10 per cent service-connected disability;
23 in the examination to determine the qualification of applicants for
24 entrance into the classified service under merit system examination,
25 five additional points shall be added to the passing grade of a
26 veteran and ten additional points shall be added to the passing
27 grade of a disabled veteran; if a position in the classified service
28 is eliminated, employees shall be released in accordance with rules
29 which give due effect to all factors; if all job qualifications are

equal, the veteran shall be given preference over the nonveteran and the veteran shall be kept on the job.

* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
