6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the issuance of certain alcoholic
7 beverage licenses."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.15.020(e) is amended to read:

10 (e) Churches and schools. The board shall not issue a beverage
11 dispensary license or package liquor store license for the sale of
12 intoxicating liquor in any building within 200 feet of a school ground
13 or church building measured by the shortest direct line from the school
14 ground or church building in which religious services are conducted,
15 within or without any corporate municipality nor for use in any
16 building within 200 feet [TWO MILES] of an accredited college or
17 university certified by Northwest Association for the Accrediting of
18 Institutions of Formal Education. The 200-foot limit shall be measured
19 by the shortest direct line beginning at the outer boundary lines of
20 the university campus or ground actually used and occupied for educa-
21 tional purposes. A license may be reissued or transferred from one
22 licensee to another, for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building
23 in which that sale was authorized by law on April 25, 1960. When a
24 license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building within 200
25 feet of a school ground or church building in which religious services
26 are conducted is forfeited, lapses or is transferred to other premises,
27 no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor at the prior licensed
28 location shall thereafter be issued. However, the location may be re-
29 licensed in the event of the removal of either cause of the restriction.
