6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the issuance of certain alcoholic
7 beverage licenses."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.15.020(e) is amended to read:

10 (e) Churches and schools. The board shall not issue a beverage
11 dispensary license or package liquor store license for the sale of [ANY]
12 intoxicating liquor in any building in which the public entrance is
13 within 200 feet of a school ground or church building measured by the
14 shortest pedestrian route [DIRECT LINE] from the outer boundaries of
15 the school ground or public entrance of a church building in which
16 religious services are conducted, within or outside [WITHOUT] any
17 corporate municipality nor for use [IN ANY BUILDING] within one mile
18 [TWO MILES] of a land grant [AN ACCREDITED] college or university
19 certified by Northwest Association for the Accrediting of Institutions
20 of Formal Education. A license may be reissued or transferred from one
21 licensee to another, for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building
22 in which that sale was authorized by law on April 25, 1960. When a
23 license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in a building within 200
24 feet of a school ground or church building in which religious services
25 are conducted is forfeited, lapses or is transferred to other premises,
26 no license for the sale of intoxicating liquor at the prior licensed
27 location shall thereafter be issued. However, the location may be
28 relicensed in the event of the removal of either cause of the restric-
29 tion.
