6 For an Act entitled: "An Act allowing Alaska's delegation to Congress
7 coverage under the state retirement system; and pro-
8 viding for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 39.35 is amended by adding a new section to read:

11 Sec. 39.35.285. THE ALASKA DELEGATION TO CONGRESS. The state
12 shall calculate and pay the employer contribution due for the members
13 of the state's delegation to the Congress of the United States who
14 elect to be covered under this system.

15 * Sec. 2. AS 39.35.680(5)(B) is amended to read:

16 (B) means an elected official including a member of the
17 state's delegation to the Congress of the United States who, with-
18 in 60 days after taking the oath of his office or within 60 days
19 after May 12, 1966, elects to pay contributions required of an
20 employee and to be included in the system under sec. 125 of this
21 chapter;

22 * Sec. 3. This Act is retroactive to January 1, 1961, so that persons
23 who were members of the state's delegation to the Congress of the United
24 States at that time may pay their past due contributions and interest ac-
25 cumulated into the system and receive the benefits of the system. A member
26 shall have 60 days after the actual effective date of the Act to notify the
27 commissioner of administration that he wishes to be included in the system.

28 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and
29 approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
