6 For an Act entitled: "An Act changing the dates of certain legal holidays;
7 and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 44.12.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 Sec. 44.12.010. LEGAL HOLIDAYS. The following days are legal
11 holidays: (1) the first of January, known as New Year Day; (2) the
12 third Monday in February, known as Presidents Day; (3) the thirtieth
13 of March, known as Seward Day; (4) the last Monday in May, known as
14 Memorial Day or Decoration Day; (5) the first Monday in July, known
15 as Independence Day; (6) the first Monday in September, known as
16 Labor Day; (7) the eighteenth of October, known as Alaska Day; (8)
17 the last Monday in October, known as Veterans Day; (9) the fourth
18 Monday in November, known as Thanksgiving; (10) the twenty-fifth of
19 December; (11) every Sunday; (12) every day designated by public
20 proclamation by the President of the United States or the governor of
21 the state as a legal holiday.

22 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1970, contingent upon
23 passage of H.R. 11679, 90th Congress, 1st Session (1967).
