6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the purchase of intoxicating
7 liquor."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 04.15.065. IDENTIFICATION CARD. (a) A person 19 years of
11 age or over may make application to the Department of Public Safety for
12 an identification card to establish his age and identity. Written
13 application shall be made upon a form prescribed by the Department of
14 Public Safety. The application shall state the applicant's name, sex,
15 address, date of birth as proved by a birth certificate or other
16 proof of age shown to the department, and shall briefly describe the
17 applicant. If the department is satisfied that the applicant is
18 qualified to obtain an identification card, it shall issue the card.

19 (b) The identification card shall contain a distinguishing
20 number assigned to the applicant, a picture of the applicant, a space
21 for information as to whom to notify in case of emergency, a space for
22 the name of the applicant's doctor, a space for notation of any allergies
23 of the applicant, and either a facsimile of the signature of the ap-
24 plicant or a space upon which the applicant shall write his signature
25 in ink immediately upon receipt of the card. The fee for an identifica-
26 tion card is \$3. The card shall bear the following language in large
27 type across its face: This card is for identification only.

28 (c) The identification card shall be of such material that the
29 information on it cannot be altered and shall be sealed in laminated

plastic.

(d) The identification card shall be proof of age in the purchase of intoxicating liquor when presented by the owner of the card to the seller of the liquor. The liquor licensee shall not be held liable for any of the penalties imposed for serving a minor or permitting a minor on the premises when such an identification card indicates that the owner and possessor of the card is 21 years of age or older.
