6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the appointment and functions of  
7 borough attorneys."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 07.20.060 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

10 (c) The president of the assembly shall appoint a borough  
11 attorney, subject to confirmation of the appointment by a majority of  
12 the members of the assembly. The attorney shall hold office at the  
13 pleasure of a majority of the members of the assembly. He shall serve  
14 as legal advisor of the assembly and the other officers of the city and  
15 shall represent the borough as attorney in all civil and criminal pro-  
16 ceedings in which the borough is interested.

18 (b) Within three years after incorporation under this title, the  
19 chairman, with the advice and assistance of the borough attorney [ A  
20 LEGAL ADVISOR], shall cause to be prepared a general codification of all  
21 borough ordinances and resolutions having the force and effect of law.  
22 The borough code shall be revised and published at least every five  
23 years.

24 \* Sec. 3. AS 07.20.160(c) is amended to read:

25 (c) The assembly, with the advice and assistance of the borough  
26 attorney [A LEGAL ADVISOR], shall cause each ordinance and resolution  
27 having the force and effect of law to be printed as promptly as possible  
28 following its adoption. The printed ordinances and resolutions shall be  
29 sold to the public at reasonable prices to be fixed by the assembly.
