5 Requesting the establishment of a  
6 program for the training and con-  
7 tinuing education of assessors and  
8 property appraisers at the University  
9 of Alaska.

10 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 WHEREAS it has long been the policy of the State of Alaska that pro-  
12 perty taxation be a primary source of revenue for local governments  
13 exclusively; and

14 WHEREAS there is a severe shortage of competent assessors and appraisers  
15 in the state; and

16 WHEREAS poor assessment practices create inequities among Alaskans and  
17 distrust of both state and local governments; and

18 WHEREAS the quality of property appraisal and assessment is vital to  
19 the state;

20 BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Regents of the University of Alaska  
21 is requested to establish a program for the training and continuing education  
22 of assessors and property appraisers in order that sufficient competent  
23 persons can be available to local governments to maintain a high standard of  
24 equity and uniformity of property tax assessment.
