4 FIFTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Proposing amendments to the state
6 constitution relating to the election,
7 term of office and qualifications of
8 the attorney general.

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 Section 25, Article III, Constitution of the State of Alaska, is amended
11 to read:

12 SECTION 25. The head of each principal department shall be a
13 single executive unless otherwise provided by law. He shall be
14 appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a majority of
15 the members of the legislature in joint session, and shall serve at
16 the pleasure of the governor, except as otherwise provided in this
17 article with respect to the secretary of state and the attorney general.
18 The heads of all principal departments shall be citizens of the United
19 States.

21 FURTHER RESOLVED that Article III, Constitution of the State of Alaska,
22 is amended by adding new sections to read:

23 SECTION 28. The attorney general of the State shall be at least
24 twenty-six years of age and a qualified voter of the State. He shall
25 be licensed to practice law in the State and shall have been a resident
26 of Alaska at least four years immediately preceding his filing for
27 office.

28 SECTION 29. The attorney general of the State shall be nominated
29 in the manner provided by law for nominating candidates for other

elective offices. The attorney general shall be chosen by the qualified voters of the State at a general election. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes shall be attorney general.

SECTION 30. The term of office of the attorney general is four years, which term shall be concurrent with the term of the Governor.

FURTHER RESOLVED that these proposed amendments be placed before the voters of the state at the next statewide election in conformity with Section 1, Article XIII, Constitution of the State of Alaska, and the election laws of the state.
