SIXTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to release on bail after conviction."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 12.30.040 is amended to read:

Sec. 12.30.040. RELEASE AFTER CONVICTION. A person who has been convicted of an offense and is awaiting sentence, or who has filed an appeal shall be treated in accordance with the provisions of sec. 20 of this chapter unless the court has reason to believe that no one or more conditions of release will reasonably assure the appearance of the person as required or prevent the person from posing a danger to other persons and the community. If that determination is made, the person may be remanded to custody. This section does not affect the right of a person appealing from a judgment of conviction from a magistrate court to the superior court to be released on bail pending appeal under Rule 2(c) of the Magistrate Rules of Criminal Procedure. This section does not apply to a person who is appealing from, or awaiting sentence for, a conviction of first degree murder.
