6 For an Act entitled: "An Act establishing the Alaska Maritime Academy."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 14.40 is amended by adding new sections to read:

9 ARTICLE 10. ALASKA MARITIME ACADEMY.

10 Sec. 14.40.850. ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE. (a) The Alaska  
11 Maritime Academy is established at Kodiak, for the purpose of giving  
12 instruction during a three or four year training program in the  
13 science and practice of navigation, seamanship, steam, diesel, and  
14 electrical engineering to persons who meet the qualifications required  
15 by secs. 850 - 930 of this chapter and those established by the board.

16 (b) In addition to the training program established by (a) of  
17 this section, the academy shall offer a short term training program  
18 designed to qualify fishing boat masters and engineers for licenses  
19 required for their vessels.

20 (c) The academy is a college of the University of Alaska and is  
21 under the general supervision of the Board of Regents of the University  
22 of Alaska.

23 Sec. 14.40.860. POWERS OF THE BOARD IN RELATION TO THE ACADEMY.  
24 The board shall:

25 (1) appoint a superintendent of the academy and all  
26 necessary instructors and other employees;

27 (2) determine the powers, duties, and compensation of the  
28 superintendent, instructors, and employees;

29 (3) fix the terms upon which students are accepted into

1 and instructed in the academy, and suspended, discharged, or graduated  
2 from it;

3 (4) confer such appropriate degrees as it may determine  
4 and prescribe;

5 (5) adopt the rules, orders, and plans which it considers  
6 necessary for the good government of the academy.

7 Sec. 14.40.870. APPLICATION TO FEDERAL GOVERNMENT. The governor  
8 may make application in writing to the federal government to furnish  
9 a suitable training vessel with all her apparel, charts, books, and  
10 instruments of navigation, and a reservation with all buildings and  
11 equipment on it to be used for the benefit of the academy.

12 Sec. 14.40.880. RECEIPT AND USE OF VESSELS AND RESERVATIONS.  
13 The board may receive from the federal government or from other  
14 sources and use for the accommodation of the academy, a vessel detailed  
15 or furnished with all apparel, charts, books, and instruments of  
16 navigation, and a reservation with all buildings and equipment on it.

17 Sec. 14.40.890. EXPENDITURES AND REPORT. The board may  
18 annually expend for the purposes of the academy any funds which the  
19 legislature appropriates and any funds which are received from the  
20 federal government for the purpose of aiding in the maintenance of the  
21 academy. The board shall keep detailed accounts of all these expendi-  
22 tures and shall make a complete report of them annually to the  
23 governor.

24 Sec. 14.40.900. POWERS AND DUTIES OF SUPERINTENDENT. The super-  
25 intendent of the academy has, subject to the regulations of the board,  
26 the direct control, management and supervision of the academy and its  
27 property, and any additional powers and duties which may be provided  
28 by the regulations of the board.

29 Sec. 14.40.910. CRUISE EXPENSES. The board may, out of any

1 appropriation made for the support of the academy, withdraw a sum not  
2 to exceed \$30,000 to be paid to the commanding officer of the vessel  
3 used by the academy to provide for the payment of expenses of training  
4 cruises.

5 Sec. 14.40.920. ADMISSIONS AND TUITION FEES. (a) Any male  
6 resident of the state who has the required qualifications may be  
7 admitted to the academy as a student.

8 (b) Each student shall pay the tuition fee fixed by the board,  
9 but the fee may not be fixed at less than \$135 a trimester.

10 (c) The tuition fee required of a student under (b) of this  
11 section may be reduced by the board in the amount received by the  
12 state on account of the student from the federal government or other  
13 governmental agency.

14 Sec. 14.40.930. ADMISSION AND TUITION FEE OF NONRESIDENT STUDENTS.  
15 Qualified nonresident students may be admitted to the academy when  
16 vacancies occur, subject to the payment of a tuition fee in such  
17 amount as the board fixes, but the fee may not be fixed at less than  
18 \$225 a trimester.

19 Sec. 14.40.940. DEFINITIONS. In secs. 850 - 930 of this chapter

20 (1) "academy" means the Alaska Maritime Academy;

21 (2) "board" means the Board of Regents of the University of  
22 Alaska.
