6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the confidentiality of employment
7 security records; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.20.110(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) The department shall hold information obtained from an
11 employing unit or individual in the course of administering this
12 chapter and determinations as to the benefit rights of an individual
13 confidential and may not disclose them or open them to public inspection
14 in a manner which reveals the identity of the individual or employing
15 unit. A claimant or his legal representative is entitled to informa-
16 tion from the records of the department to the extent necessary for
17 the proper presentation of his claim in a proceeding under this chapter.
18 Subject to restrictions which the department prescribes by regulation
19 the information may be made available to an agency of this state or
20 another state or federal agency charged with the administration of an
21 unemployment compensation law or the maintenance of a system of public
22 employment offices, or, for the purposes of the Federal Unemployment Tax
23 Act, to the Internal Revenue Service [BUREAU OF INTERNAL REVENUE] of
24 the United States, or, to the Department of Revenue. Information
25 obtained in connection with the administration of the employment
26 service may be made available to persons or agencies for purposes
27 appropriate to the operation of a public employment service.

28 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval
29 or on the day it becomes law without approval.
