6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to excise tax credits on alcoholic
7 beverages; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 43.60.020(c) is amended to read:

10 (c) Each brewer, distiller, bottler, jobber, wholesaler, manu-
11 facturer, or other consignor is entitled to a credit for 50 per cent of
12 the excise taxes paid on alcoholic beverages which have been sold and
13 delivered to a United States government operated vessel for ship's
14 stores, ship's service stores, and to a post exchange, officers club,
15 noncommissioned officers club, or club maintained for enlisted personnel
16 and to other authorized beverage dispensers on a military, naval, air
17 force or governmental reservation in the state upon furnishing proof in
18 the form of signed and certified invoices evidencing sales to a mili-
19 tary, naval, air force or governmental liquor dispensary.

20 * Sec. 2. AS 43.60.020(d) is amended to read:

21 (d) Upon receipt of the monthly statement, the department shall
22 promptly allow credit to the account of, and issue a notice showing the
23 amount of credit allowed to, the brewer, distiller, bottler, jobber,
24 wholesaler, manufacturer, or other consignor for 50 per cent of that
25 portion of the excise taxes which have been paid on sales which are
26 exempted under (c) of this section.

27 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect May 1, 1969.
