6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to liquor licenses."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 04.10.210(1) is amended to read:

9 (1) outside an incorporated city [TOWN] where the total of
10 licensed premises in the aggregate at one time would exceed one
11 license of each type for each 1,500 population or fraction thereof
12 within a radius of five miles of the proposed location;

13 * Sec. 2. AS 04.10.230 is amended to read:

14 Sec. 04.10.230. ZONING LIMITATIONS. No licensee may operate a
15 beverage dispensary or retail liquor store in any incorporated
16 municipality [CITY] where the zoning regulations of the municipality
17 [CITY] prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors, without the approval
18 of the city council of the incorporated city, or, if the licensed
19 premises are within the area of an organized borough outside the
20 boundaries of an incorporated city, the approval of the borough
21 assembly.

22 * Sec. 3. AS 04.10.300 is amended to read:

23 Sec. 04.10.300. PROTEST OF ISSUANCE. A resident of an area out-
24 side an incorporated municipality [TOWN] who desires to protest the
25 issuance of a license in the voting area in which he resides, shall
26 serve upon the applicant and the board a written statement of the
27 reasons for his protest. Upon the receipt of the protest, the board
28 may give notice and hold a hearing, in the voting precinct in which
29 the protestant resides, at which all persons interested may be heard.

1 If at the hearing it appears that the majority of the citizens over
2 the age of 21 years, residing within two miles of the place for which
3 a license is sought, object to the issuance of the license, the board
4 shall refuse to issue the license.
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
