6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to liquor licenses."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 04.10.210(1) is amended to read:

9 (1) outside an incorporated city [TOWN] where the total of
10 licensed premises in the aggregate at one time would exceed one license
11 of each type for each 1,500 population or fraction thereof within a
12 radius of five miles of the proposed location;

13 * Sec. 2. AS 04.10.230 is amended to read:

14 Sec. 04.10.230. ZONING LIMITATIONS. No licensee may operate a
15 beverage dispensary or retail liquor store in any incorporated municipi-
16 pality [CITY] where the zoning regulations of the municipality [CITY]
17 prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors, without the approval of the
18 city council of the incorporated city, or, if the licensed premises are
19 within the area of an organized borough outside the boundaries of an
20 incorporated city, the approval of the borough assembly.

21 * Sec. 3. AS 04.10.300 is amended to read:

22 Sec. 04.10.300. PROTEST OF ISSUANCE. A resident of an area out-
23 side an incorporated municipality [TOWN] who desires to protest the
24 issuance of a license in the voting area in which he resides, shall
25 serve upon the applicant and the board a written statement of the
26 reasons for his protest. Upon the receipt of the protest, the board
27 may give notice and hold a hearing, in the voting precinct in which
28 the protestant resides, at which all persons interested may be heard.
29 If at the hearing it appears that the majority of the citizens over the

1 age of 21 years, residing within two miles of the place for which a
2 license is sought, object to the issuance of the license, the board
3 shall refuse to issue the license.

4 * Sec. 4. AS 04.15.010 is amended to read:

5 Sec. 04.15.010. HOURS OF SALE. No person may consume, sell,
6 offer for sale, give, furnish or deliver from an authorized licensee any
7 intoxicating liquor on any licensed premises inside the state between
8 the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. each day of the week. Cities, and
9 first and second class boroughs in areas outside cities, [INCORPORATED
10 MUNICIPALITIES] may provide for additional closing hours under sec. 70
11 of this chapter.
