6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the medical profession; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 08.64.200(3) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 (3) submit a certificate of one full year's internship
11 or residency in a program approved by the American Medical Association.

12 * Sec. 2. AS 08.64.200 is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

13 (4) not have a license to practice medicine in another
14 state, province, or territory which is currently suspended or
15 revoked.

16 * Sec. 3. AS 08.64.205 is amended to read:

17 Sec. 08.64.205. QUALIFICATIONS FOR OSTEOPATH APPLICANTS. Each
18 osteopath applicant shall meet the qualifications prescribed in
19 sec. 200(1) and (4) of this chapter and shall

20 (1) submit a certificate of graduation from a legally
21 chartered school of osteopathy approved by the board;

22 (2) submit a certificate from a hospital approved by the
23 American Osteopathic Association which certifies that he has faith-
24 fully completed and performed the duties of resident osteopathic
25 physician for one year;

26 (3) take the examination required by sec. 210 of this
27 chapter; no waiver of this requirement for an osteopath applicant
28 shall be given, the provisions of AS 08.64.250 notwithstanding.

29 * Sec. 4. AS 08.64.210 is amended to read:

1 Sec. 08.64.210. EXAMINATION REQUIRED. (a) The applicant
2 shall take an examination in the medical and basic sciences in
3 subjects the board considers necessary.

4 (b) The application for examination shall be submitted to
5 the board at least 40 days prior to the examination date.

6 * Sec. 5. AS 08.64.225 is amended to read:

7 Sec. 08.64.225. FOREIGN MEDICAL GRADUATES. Applicants who
8 are graduates of medical colleges not accredited by the American
9 Medical Association or one of its agencies shall meet the require-
10 ments of sec. 200(1), [AND] (3) and (4) of this chapter and shall
11 (1) pass the [MUST HAVE PASSED AN] examination given by the board
12 and be certified by the Education Council on Foreign Medical
13 Graduates; [,] or (2) meet the requirements of sec. 250 of this
14 chapter [BE LICENSED BY EXAMINATION IN ANOTHER STATE OR PROVINCE
15 WITH WHICH ALASKA RECIPROCATES].

16 * Sec. 6. AS 08.64.250 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

17 Sec. 08.64.250. LICENSE BY ENDORSEMENT. The board may waive
18 the examination requirement and grant a license by endorsement if
19 the applicant meets the qualifications of sec. 200 of this chapter,
20 pays the required fee and has

21 (1) a license issued by examination from a board of
22 medical examiners established under the laws of a state or territory
of the United States or a province of Canada;

23 (2) passed each portion of the examination given by the
24 Federation of State Medical Boards of the United States, Inc.; or

25 (3) been declared a diplomate of the National Board of
26 Medical Examiners.

27 * Sec. 7. AS 08.64.270 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

28 Sec. 08.64.270. TEMPORARY PERMITS. (a) The board may issue
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a nonrenewable temporary permit to an applicant for licensure by endorsement or by examination who meets the requirements of sec. 200 of this chapter and pays the required fee.

(b) A temporary permit issued to an applicant for licensure by endorsement is valid for eight months or until the board meets to consider the application, whichever occurs first.

(c) A temporary permit issued to an applicant for licensure by examination is valid for eight months or until the results of the first examination for which the applicant is scheduled are published, whichever occurs first. If the applicant fails to take the first examination for which he is scheduled his temporary permit is revoked on the day of the examination.
