6 For an Act entitled: "An Act amending the residence requirement for admis-  
7 sion to the bar; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 08.08.130 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 08.08.130. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION. (a) A person who does  
11 not qualify under sec. 140 of this chapter is eligible for admission to  
12 the Alaska Bar if he

13 (1) is a citizen of the United States;

14 (2) is over 21 years of age;

15 (3) has been a bona fide resident of the state and physically  
16 residing in the state for at least 30 [60] days immediately before the  
17 date of his [APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION BY] examination and continuing  
18 to and including the date of his admission [OR BY RECIPROCITY, AND THE  
19 DATE FOR THE EXAMINATION FOR ADMISSION OR THE DATE FOR CERTIFICATION BY  
20 THE BOARD THAT THE PERSON BE ADMITTED BY RECIPROCITY SHALL BE AT LEAST  
21 90 DAYS AFTER THE APPLICATION IS MADE];

22 (4) is a graduate of a law school approved by the American  
23 Bar Association, or an attorney in good standing in the bar of another  
24 state or territory, or has begun a clerkship before January 1, 1967,  
25 and completed it in the manner required by sec. 35-2-44 ACILA 1949;

26 (5) has passed a bar examination given by the Alaska Bar.

27 (b) The date for the examination shall be at least 75 days after  
28 the application for admission is made.

29 \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval

1 or on the day it becomes law without approval.
