6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to safety practices by railroad
7 companies."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 23.10.420. TRAIN CREWS. (a) No person operating an I.C.C.
11 regulated railroad offering passenger service in this state may operate
12 a train or engine, outside of yard limits, regardless of the form of
13 energy used for propulsion, unless it meets the following requirements:

14 (1) a passenger train shall have at least a minimum passenger
15 crew, which shall consist of one locomotive engineer, one locomotive
16 fireman (or helper), one conductor, one brakeman, and one flagman;

17 (2) a freight train shall have at least a minimum freight
18 crew, which shall consist of one locomotive engineer, one locomotive
19 fireman (or helper), one conductor, and two brakemen;

20 (3) a light engine without cars shall have at least a minimum
21 light engine crew, which shall consist of one locomotive engineer, one
22 locomotive fireman (or helper), and one conductor.

23 (b) Except for hostling movements and duties as negotiated for
24 each railroad company, no person operating an I.C.C. regulated rail-
25 road offering passenger service in this state may operate an engine
26 or locomotive, regardless of the form of energy used for propulsion,
27 for switching cars or in transfer movements, unless every engine or
28 locomotive is manned by a minimum crew which shall consist of one
29 locomotive engineer, one locomotive fireman (or helper), one conductor,

1 and two helpers.

2 (c) In this section "engine" includes connected, multiple units
3 under single control.

4 (d) A person who violates a provision of this section may be
5 fined up to \$500 upon conviction. Each violation constitutes a
6 separate offense.
