HOUSE BILL NO. 779

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA  
SIXTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act appropriating to the Department of Public Works; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. The sum of \$125,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Public Works for repair and renovation of, and installation of fire protection equipment in, the Erskine House, Kodiak, Alaska. The Erskine House, a large, two-story frame structure overlooking the harbor, was erected in 1793-94 by Alexander Baranov as a fur storage facility for the Russian American Company; the building is the oldest Russian structure standing in the United States, and currently serves as a museum.

\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without approval.
