5 Requesting the Law Revision Commission  
6 to undertake a study of procedural and  
7 substantive defects in criminal law.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS certain inequities in the administration of criminal justice  
10 occur because of defects in the law; and

11 WHEREAS the failure to correct these defects leads to disrespect of the  
12 law, demoralizes law enforcement officials, and encourages unjustified  
13 criticism of the courts which must enforce the law as it is written;

14 BE IT RESOLVED that the legislature requests the Alaska Law Revision  
15 Commission to conduct a survey of all judicial officers of the state, the  
16 attorneys in the Department of Law, the state troopers, municipal police  
17 officers, enforcement officers of the Department of Fish and Game, members  
18 of the Alaska Bar Association, and other interested persons and groups to  
19 compile and study opinions on what is wrong with the administration of  
20 criminal justice and what procedural and substantive defects need correcting  
21 and be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission is requested to report to the  
23 First Session of the Seventh State Legislature on its analysis of the survey  
24 and its resulting recommendations for legislation, and report to the Alaska  
25 Supreme Court on its recommendations for changes in the court rules.
