5 Supporting the immediate commencement
6 of construction on the pulp mill at
7 Berners Bay.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS a tremendous amount of study and research has already been
10 undertaken by both government and industry in an effort to ascertain whether
11 a pulp mill on Berners Bay would be detrimental to the ecology of the area;
12 and

13 WHEREAS the study and research carried out in Berners Bay and the
14 surrounding area has revealed that the ecology there would not be adversely
15 affected by the construction and operation of a pulp mill; and

16 WHEREAS the time devoted to studying the effects that a pulp mill would
17 have upon the entire environment in and around Berners Bay has been exten-
18 sive; and

19 WHEREAS the various federal and state agencies having the specific
20 responsibility of determining whether or not the operation of a pulp mill
21 would be detrimental to an area, have given their support to the Berners Bay
22 project;

23 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska Legislature hereby expresses its support
24 for the immediate commencement of construction on the pulp mill at Berners
25 Bay.
