2 HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 28

3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SIXTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

5 Relating to the BIA school in St. Michael.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

7 WHEREAS children are the key human resource of our country and are of
8 primary importance to our national strength and prosperity; and

9 WHEREAS good education is an essential prerequisite to children ful-
10 filling their great potential; and

11 WHEREAS the people of St. Michael, Alaska, are faced with the prospect
12 of having their children's schooling reduced to one-half day due to lack of
13 classroom space and a shortage of qualified teachers; and

14 WHEREAS there is no hope of relief from this situation through normal
15 channels due to lack of funds; and

16 WHEREAS the people of St. Michael call attention to the suggestion in
17 Senator Mike Gravel's book, Jobs and More Jobs, that one way of eliminating
18 some of these problems is to use unemployed persons as instructional aides
19 under the guidance of qualified teachers;

20 BE IT RESOLVED that the Sixth Legislature of the State of Alaska
21 urges the Secretary of the Interior to supply two additional small class-
22 rooms and three additional teacher's aides to the Bureau of Indian Aff rs
23 school in St. Michael, Alaska; and be it

24 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of the Interior is urged to make
25 a survey of all other BIA schools in Alaska in order to determine the need
26 for like increases in classrooms and teacher aides.

27 COPIES of this Resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Walter J.
28 Michel, Secretary of the Interior; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the
29 Honorable Mike Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Howard W. Pollock,

1 U. S. Representative, members of the Alaska delegation in Congress.
