IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

SIXTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act changing the dates of certain legal holidays;  
and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 44.12.010 is repealed and re-enacted to read:

Sec. 44.12.010. LEGAL HOLIDAYS. The following days are legal holidays: (1) the first of January, known as New Year Day; (2) the third Monday in February, known as Washington's Birthday; (3) the 30th of March, known as Seward Day; (4) the last Monday in May, known as Memorial Day; (5) the fourth of July, known as Independence Day; (6) the first Monday in September, known as Labor Day; (7) the second Monday in October, known as Columbus Day; (8) the 18th of October, known as Alaska Day; (9) the fourth Monday in October, known as Veterans Day; (10) the fourth Thursday in November, known as Thanksgiving Day; (11) the 25th of December, known as Christmas Day; (12) every Sunday; (13) every day designated by public proclamation by the President of the United States or the governor of the state as a legal holiday.

\* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on January 1, 1971.
