6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the compilation of jury lists."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 \* Section 1. AS 09.20.050 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 09.20.050. JURY LIST. At such times as the presiding judge  
10 of the superior court in each judicial district may designate, but not  
11 less than once every two years, the clerk of the superior court in each  
12 judicial district shall prepare a list of the names of residents of the  
13 district who are qualified by law for jury service, and who either  
14 purchased a resident hunting or fishing license, filed a state income  
15 tax return for the preceding year or voted in the preceding general  
16 election. If the superior court is located in different cities in the  
17 same judicial district, the clerk of the court located in each city  
18 shall prepare, at the times designated by the judge but at least every  
19 two years, a list of names of persons qualified for jury service and  
20 who either purchased a resident hunting or fishing license, filed a  
21 state income tax return for the preceding year or voted in the preceding  
22 general election, and who are residents of that portion of the judicial  
23 district designated by the presiding judge. The list shall be based on  
24 the list of persons, prepared by the Department of Revenue or the  
25 Department of Fish and Game, who either purchased a resident hunting  
26 or fishing license, or who filed a state income tax return for the  
27 preceding year and the voting list prepared by the secretary of state  
28 from the preceding general election. A questionnaire for prospective  
29 jurors may be adopted and submitted to them by the administrative

1 director of courts. A copy of the list shall be transmitted only to  
2 each district magistrate within the judicial district and shall be used  
3 to summon jurors residing within the immediate area of the court and  
4 for no other purpose.
