6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to alcoholic beverage licensing."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 04.10.040(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) The holder of a beverage dispensary license may sell for
10 cash or serve on the premises beer, wine and hard liquors for con-
11 sumption on the premises only. The beverage dispensary license fee
12 is \$1,000 [\$500] in all towns, villages, settlements, and places
13 having a population not exceeding 1,500 persons and \$1,500 [\$1,000]
14 in all towns, villages and incorporated cities having a population in
15 excess of 1,500 persons. A beverage dispensary license is issued on
16 the basis of one for every 3,000 people. The population shall be
17 determined at the time of filing the application. Each applicant for
18 a beverage dispensary license shall file with the application a cash
19 bond or a surety bond executed by a surety company approved by the
20 board. The condition of the bond or undertaking shall be that the
21 applicant or applicants are the sole owners of the business to be
22 licensed, and that no other person is financially interested directly
23 or indirectly, and that the applicant or applicants will conduct the
24 business in accordance with the applicable laws pertaining to intoxi-
25 cating liquor in the state. The bond shall be in the penal sum of
26 \$2,500. Upon revocation of the license, the bond may be forfeited and
27 the amount deposited into the general fund of the state.

28 * Sec. 2. AS 04.10.100 is amended to read:

29 Sec. 04.10.100. RETAIL LICENSE. The holder of a retail license

1 may sell for cash in his establishment intoxicating liquors in the
2 original packages and wine in bulk, except as provided in sec. 255 of
3 this chapter. All liquor requiring internal revenue strip stamps
4 shall have the stamps intact upon the packages. The consumption of
5 intoxicating liquor on premises licensed under this provision is
6 prohibited. Sales under a retail license shall be limited to less
7 than five wine gallons to any one person in any one sale. The retail
8 license fee is \$600, but the retail license fee for a retail liquor
9 store having gross sales from the sale of intoxicating liquors not
10 exceeding \$20,000 in any calendar year is \$300.

11 ■ Sec. 3. AS 04.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

12 Sec. 04.10.255. LIMITATION ON RETAIL LICENSES. No licensee may
13 operate a retail liquor store in any community having a population of
14 2,500 or less.
