6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to property exempt from execution."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 09.35.080(1) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

9 (1) the income of the judgment debtor, regardless of when it
10 became payable, for work performed during the preceeding 30 days, or
11 otherwise earned or inured to his benefit within the 30-day period;
12 the 30-day period shall be reckoned back from the date of the levy, but
13 the exemption may not exceed \$350 if he is the head of a family, and
14 the amount of \$200 if he is a single man; the amount of the exemption
15 shall be computed after deductions and withholding for federal or state
16 income tax, school tax, disaster tax, social security, unemployment
17 compensation insurance, child-support payments, or any other deduction
18 required by law, so as to assure the judgment debtor the receipt of the
19 first \$350 per month if he is the head of a family or \$200 if he is a
20 single man; the judgment debtor may not be required to file an affi-
21 davit or otherwise take affirmative action to avail himself of this
22 exemption, except as otherwise provided by law;
