6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state ferry passage for state  
7 employees; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 39.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 39.20.186. FERRY PASSAGE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES. (a) After  
11 two complete years of unbroken state service with the exception of  
12 military leave, a state employee is entitled to one-half fare on the  
13 state ferries on a space available basis; after three years of unbroken  
14 state service with the exception of military leave, a state employee  
15 is entitled to travel free on a space available basis; after four  
16 years of unbroken state service with the exception of military leave,  
17 a state employee and his immediate family are entitled to travel free  
18 on a space available basis; after five years of unbroken state service  
19 with the exception of military leave, a state employee, his immediate  
20 family and their passenger car are entitled to travel free on a space  
21 available basis. A service charge may be invoked to cover administra-  
22 tive costs.

23 (b) A numbered identification card containing a picture of the  
24 state employee and a description of him, the department in which he is  
25 employed, date of service, official seal, number and names of dependents,  
26 shall be used to claim a reduced or free fare. The Department of  
27 Administration shall prepare these cards for each requesting state  
28 employee. The expense incurred for making up this card shall be borne  
29 by the employee. The card shall be returned to the Department of

1 Administration upon termination of employment.

2 (c) All other services including but not limited to staterooms,  
3 food, and beverages shall be borne by the employee.

4 \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect June 1, 1969.
