3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 SIXTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to compensation for teachers; and  
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 14.20.220(a)(1) is amended to read:

10 (1) The base salary of a teacher with three years' training  
11 is \$8,600 [\$5,400] for a teacher with no nonpublic or public school  
12 experience in or outside the state. The salary is augmented by \$200  
13 for each year of nonpublic or public school experience in or outside  
14 the state up to and including four years.

15 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.20.220(a)(2) is amended to read:

16 (2) The base salary for a teacher holding a bachelor's  
17 degree and having the requisite number of hours in education is \$9,600  
18 [\$6,400]. This salary is augmented by the sum of .04 times the base  
19 for each year of nonpublic or public school experience in or, subject  
20 to (e) of this section, outside the state up to and including eight  
21 years.

22 \* Sec. 3. AS 14.20.220(a)(3) is amended to read:

23 (3) The base salary for a teacher having a master's degree  
24 and the required number of hours of education is \$11,100 [\$6,900].  
25 This salary is augmented by the sum of .04 times the base for each year  
26 of nonpublic or public teaching experience in or, subject to (e) of  
27 this section, outside the state up to and including 12 years.

28 \* Sec. 4. AS 14.20.220(d) is amended to read:

29 (d) The department, as the operating agency of schools outside

1 school districts, shall pay a regularly qualified teacher employed by  
2 the state a salary of not less than \$1,100 above the salary established  
3 by (a), (b), (c), (f) or (g) of this section, with an increment of  
4 \$500 [\$300] for a bachelor's degree plus 18 hours training, with an  
5 equal increment of \$500 for a bachelor's degree plus 36 hours training,  
6 and an equal increment of \$500 [\$300] for a master's degree plus 18  
7 hours training, an equal increment of \$500 for a master's degree plus  
8 36 hours training, an equal increment of \$500 for a programmed degree  
9 beyond the master's degree plus 36 hours training, and an equal incre-  
10 ment of \$500 for a doctorate degree above the programmed degree. How-  
11 ever, in the state-operated schools, for teachers with bachelor's  
12 degrees or higher instead of augmenting the base salary by .04, each  
13 salary shall be augmented by .05 times the base for each year of public  
14 school experience in the state up to and including eight years for  
15 teachers with a bachelor's degree, 10 years for teachers with a bache-  
16 lor's degree plus 18 hours of training, 11 years for teachers with a  
17 bachelor's degree plus 36 hours of training, 12 years for teachers with  
18 a master's degree, [AND] 14 years for teachers with a master's degree  
19 plus 18 hours of training, and 15 years for teachers with a master's  
20 degree plus 36 hours of training. The base salary used in this sub-  
21 section is the actual beginning salary, for a teacher with a bachelor's  
22 degree and no experience, in the area where the teacher will teach.

23 \* Sec. 5. AS 14.20.220(e) is amended to read:

24 (e) For teachers holding bachelors' degrees not [NOT] more than  
25 six [FOUR] years of nonpublic or public school experience outside the  
26 state may be substituted for a like period of [PUBLIC] school experi-  
27 ence in the state when a teacher's position on the salary scale is  
28 established and for teachers holding masters' degrees not more than  
29 eight years of nonpublic or public school experience outside the state.

1 may be substituted for a like period of school experience in the state  
2 when a teacher's position on the salary scale is established.

3 \* Sec. 6. AS 14.25.220(3) is amended to read:

4 (3) "creditable service" means outside service not exceeding  
5 10 years and in-state BIA service with no limitation on years [NOT  
6 EXCEEDING FIVE YEARS], plus membership service as provided in (5) of  
7 this section;

8 \* Sec. 7. AS 14.25.220(8) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

9 (8) "outside service" means service as

10 (A) a full-time elementary or secondary teacher in  
11 out-of-state public schools; or

12 (B) a full-time elementary or secondary teacher in an  
13 out-of-state approved or accredited nonpublic school; or

14 (C) a full-time teacher in an institution of higher  
15 learning accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency;

16 \* Sec. 8. AS 14.25.220 is amended by adding new paragraphs to read:

17 (18) "public school" means a school operated by publicly  
18 elected or appointed school officials in which the program and activi-  
19 ties are under the control of these officials and which is supported by  
20 public funds;

21 (19) "nonpublic school" means a school established by an  
22 agency other than a state or its subdivisions which is primarily sup-  
23 ported by other than public funds, and the operation of whose program  
24 rests with other than publicly elected or appointed officials, and  
25 which offers grades kindergarten through 12, or any combination of  
26 them, and is state approved or accredited.

27 \* Sec. 9. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1970.
