5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to teachers' salaries; and providing  
7 for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 14.20.220(a)(1) is amended to read:

10 (1) The base salary of a teacher with three years' training  
11 is \$5,400 for a teacher with no nonpublic or public school experience  
12 in the state. The salary is augmented by \$200 for each year of non-  
13 public or public school experience in the state up to and including  
14 four years.

15 \* Sec. 2. AS 14.20.220(a)(2) is amended to read:

16 (2) The base salary for a teacher holding a bachelor's degree  
17 and having the requisite number of hours in education is \$6,400. This  
18 salary is augmented by the sum of .04 times the base for each year of  
19 nonpublic or public school experience in the state up to and including  
20 eight years.

21 \* Sec. 3. AS 14.20.220(a)(3) is amended to read:

22 (3) The base salary for a teacher having a master's degree  
23 and the required number of hours of education is \$6,900. This salary  
24 is augmented by the sum of .04 times the base for each year of nonpublic  
25 or public teaching experience in the state up to and including 12 years.

26 \* Sec. 4. AS 14.20.220(e) is amended to read:

27 (e) Not more than four years of nonpublic or public school experi-  
28 ence outside the state may be substituted for a like period of [PUBLIC]  
29 school experience in the state when a teacher's position on the salary

1 scale is established.

2 \* Sec. 5. AS 14.25.220(8) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

3 (8) "outside service" means service as

4 (A) a full-time elementary or secondary teacher in out-  
5 of-state public schools;

6 (B) a full-time elementary or secondary teacher in a  
7 state approved or accredited nonpublic school; or

8 (C) a full-time teacher in an institution of higher  
9 learning accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency;

10 \* Sec. 6. AS 14.25.220 is amended by adding new paragraphs to read:

11 (18) "public school" means a school operated by publicly  
12 elected or appointed school officials in which the program and activi-  
13 ties are under the control of these officials and which is supported by  
14 public funds;

15 (19) "nonpublic school" means a school established by an  
16 agency other than a state or its subdivisions which is primarily sup-  
17 ported by other than public funds, and the operation of whose program  
18 rests with other than publicly elected or appointed officials, and  
19 which offers grades kindergarten through 12, or any combination of  
20 them, and is state approved or accredited.

21 \* Sec. 7. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1970.
