6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to state officials' and employees'
7 military leaves of absence; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 39.20.340 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 39.20.340. LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR RESERVE MEMBERS OF ARMED
12 FORCES. (a) An official or employee of the state, or a political
13 subdivision, or a municipal corporation with the approval of the city
14 council or borough assembly, who is a member of a reserve component
15 of the United States Armed Forces is entitled to a leave of absence
16 without loss of pay, time, or efficiency rating on all days during
17 which he is ordered to training duty, as distinguished from active
18 duty, with troops or at field exercises, or for instruction. The
19 leave of absence may not exceed 15 1/2 working days in any one
20 calendar year.

21 (b) If an employee or official is called to active duty by the
22 governor, an employee or official otherwise qualified in (a) of this
23 section is entitled to five days leave of absence without loss of
24 pay, time, or efficiency rating.

25 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect on July 1, 1970.
