6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Alaska Transportation Commis-
7 sion; and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 42.07.021(d) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 (d) The governor may remove a commissioner from office for cause
11 including but not limited to incompetence, neglect of duty or misconduct
12 in office. A commissioner, to be removed for cause, shall be given
13 a copy of the charges against him and afforded an opportunity to be
14 publicly heard in person or by counsel in his own defense upon not less
15 than 10 days notice. If a commissioner is removed for cause, the gover-
16 nor shall file with the secretary of state a complete statement of all
17 charges made against the commissioner and his finding based on the
18 charges, together with a complete record of the proceedings.

19 * Sec. 2. AS 42.07.101 is amended to read:

20 Sec. 42.07.101. EMPLOYMENT AND COMPENSATION OF PERSONNEL. (a)
21 The commission may employ engineers, hearing officers, experts, clerks,
22 accountants, and other agents and assistants it considers necessary.
23 Employees and agents of the commission, other than legal counsel, are
24 in the classified service under AS 39.25.

25 (b) In addition to its staff of regular employees the commission
26 may contract for and engage the services of the consultants, [AND]
27 experts and hearing officers the commission considers necessary for the
28 purpose of developing information or conducting studies, investigations,
29 hearings or other proceedings.

1 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval
2 or on the day it becomes law without approval.

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
